Congrats to the 2023 Environmental Sustainability Award Winners!

The Environment and Natural Resources Commission (ENRC) presented sustainability awards to five organizations at the January 23, 2024 Village Board meeting.



Greener Glenview won the Innovation category for the <u>Glenview Native</u>
<u>Habitat</u> initiative to encourage property owners to add pollinator-supporting native plants in landscapes across town. This is GG's second consecutive award.

Saints Peter and Paul Church which installed 283 solar panels on their community center rooftop to harvest emission-free energy for the next 25-30 years.

Valley Lo Towers residents who used humor, games, and a 20-page brochure to improve recycling.

The **Village Treasure House** whose volunteers have sold used furnishings since 1997, and have now donated \$4 million in proceeds to local social service agencies.

Princeton Village Homeowners Association whose landscaping committee followed the village's model and performed a tree census to care for trees on their property.

Actions You Can Take Regarding Glenview's Natural Resources

Glenview Tree Ordinance Update

Since the Glenview Board of Trustees **authorized an update at its February 7, 2023** meeting, the Environment & Natural Resources Commission (ENRC) has now been tasked with updating Glenview's Tree Preservation Ordinance. The current tree ordinance set a standard when it was adopted more than 20 years ago, focusing on preserving large "landmark" trees having diameters of at least 16". With the Morton Arboretum leading the way locally, forestry knowledge and practices have changed a great deal in the past two decades. The Arb has developed model ordinances that include protection of smaller diameter trees; they are the future tree canopy. For example, an 8" diameter tree can be 10-15 years old. Just as our children need protection, so do younger trees. This is one of several issues that will be reviewed in the update.

The <u>ENRC</u> will be meeting on February 19 at 7:00 p.m. at Village Hall to begin discussions on the update. Attend the meeting to learn and to offer your perspective.

Preservation of nature in Glenview

The Village Board will soon vote on a motion to adopt the 2023 updated <u>Plan for Nature</u> as soon as the February 20 board meeting--<u>check the agenda here</u>. Email trustees and the village manager expressing support for implementing the Plan's priorities as part of annual budgeting process . Don't let this be a plan without action, that sits on the shelf.

How is the Village of Glenview Creating a Sustainable Built Environment?

While it is important to recognize residents' and community organizations actions

to protect the environment,

even more impact can be made when municipal government takes action. The <u>Greenest Region Compact</u>, which the Village of Glenview signed on to in 2020, clearly lays out steps villages can take. However, the village has yet to develop a sustainability plan.

Without a plan establishing priorities, and staff dedicated to their implementation, opportunities are being missed. Right now there is grant money available to those who apply. The Metropolitan Mayors Caucus is encouraging villages who signed on to the GRC to apply. The U.S. EPA is offering Climate pollution reduction grants (CPRG) between \$2 million and \$500 million for state and local governments to implement priority emissions reduction measures. Ideas mentioned at the January ENRC meeting include buyback programs on gas powered landscaping equipment,

or goals laid out the in updated Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan adopted in November. The deadline for applying for these grants is April 1, 2024. Inaction in this area could be leaving money on the table.

Read This If You're Considering Installing Rooftop Solar!

Important change coming in rules for Rooftop Solar payback. Subsidies are now in place that reduce your cost for going solar by two-thirds (Federal tax credit of 30% on installation cost + 15 years' worth of SRECs paid up front). Plus, under current rules, your system starts paying you back as soon as it's connected to the grid, because of a rule covering "net metering."



The **current rule** is set up this way: 1 kilowatt hour sent to grid = I kilowatt hour OFF your bill. **New net metering rules** are expected starting January 1, 2025. The new rules are being written now, so we don't know what they'll be. But other states have already changed net metering rules. A report on the subject at Cnet reported about California net metering changes: At the end of the day, the new net billing was expected to cut compensation by 75% for electricity sent to the grid but increase the adoption of batteries, which were projected to recoup their installation costs faster than solar alone. Rooftop solar installations in place before

January 1, 2025 will continue under current net metering rules for the life of the system.
